

A Vision for Pagoda Circle

Pagoda Circle is a small park space that has been used by neighbors across generations for walks, pick-up football games, exploring the small woods. The Pagoda Circle Neighborhood Association has existed for multiple generations around Pagoda Circle. While leadership has changed over time as children grew and new families came in, the association has stayed in touch via an email list-serv and periodic community events, such as block parties.

In September 2024, the Pagoda Circle Neighborhood applied for Community Preservation Funding. The process included extensive and explicit engagement with residents, town employees, officials, and community organizations.

To further explore the themes that came up in that engagement, the Town of Milton's Masterplan Implementation Committee hired the Metropolitan Area Planning Council (MAPC) to conduct further visioning conversations about what neighbors wanted to see for Pagoda Circle.

Community members shared a desire for key infrastructure investments for safety and accessibility, along with more consistent community building opportunities, without over-developing the circle.

- Interest in seasonal programming;
- Emphasis on preserving the natural environment;
- Concern for safety and accessibility – ranging from installing benches to conducting dead tree clean up;
- Desire for high involvement from those neighboring Pagoda Circle;
