Project Title/Name Project Description

Opioid Community Assessment The Milton Board of Health hired an independent facilitator consultant November Sky Freyss-Cole to perform a comprehensive community assessment and carry out a Milton community engagement process to inform the use of funds received as part of the Opioid Recovery Remediation Fund. Sky worked with the Milton Health Department staff and people with lived experience to create a design team. Over the course of the year public workshops, focus groups, stakeholder interviews, data collection and analysis was performed. Final synthesis and presentation to the Board of Health culminated in June 2025.

Riverside Community Care Inc. Riverside Community Care Inc. are recovery coach services made available to Milton residents for free. A Recovery Coach forms community connections, connects to health providers and specialists, assists with access to living/financial supports such as SNAP benefits and transitional assistance. A Recovery Coach will assist Milton residents develop Recovery Wellness plans consisting of goals that they wish to achieve in one or more areas of life.

Health Resources in Action Health Resources in Action (HRIA) is an independent contractor service that provides services that create actionable solutions so that all people can thrive. HRIA provided a Train the Trainer session on Opioid overdose rescue and facilitative training strategies to Health Department staff. In person overdose rescue training and observed co-facilitated HRIA training was performed. A Narcan slide presentation and review of curriculum provided interactive scenarios to staff.
